PRESIDENT

Kathi Martin

During my campaign for Affiliations VP, I promised to bring advocacy, member empowerment, and passion to the position. To live up to that promise, I jumped head first into all things Union. Thanks to support from various members, I successfully completed four contract negotiations courses through Cornell as well as attended several training sessions offered by AFT-MI and Labor Notes. In July, I attended the AFT National Convention and helped work with AFT to bring Union Training to Palestinian Kindergarten Teachers. (Did you know AFT works to empower and build unions internationally?)

Over the past two years, I was asked to represent AFT-MI Educators in Lansing when the 18 Bill "Respecting Educators Package" was unveiled. I've also participated in door knocking events to get out the vote to ensure education friendly legislators get to Lansing. We launched the #RedforEd campaign to build solidarity and were successful in getting members to attend school board meetings.
