### **Lobby Day**

Lobby Day on May 4 was a success! Legislators are working on passing bills through committee that would reinstate our ability to negotiate teacher evaluations and placement. Hearings were held on May 18 and so many people turned out to testify, they added May 25th as a second date to hear from constituents. If you would like to be a part of Democracy in action, we have a few union release spots open for members.

#### **Negotiations Update**

Contract Negotiations continue and the caucus rooms have been fabulous. We've had caucus rooms open for three of our negotiation dates and we've had a great turn out. Members are sending snacks and those present are cheering on the negotiation team as they enter the negotiating room. We're also using that time for members to go through the District's check registers. This helps us understand the District's spending.

Despite the number of meetings we've had, so far, we only agree on the first day back for staff (August 23) and the first day back for students (August 28). We are still working on the complete calendar and trying to figure out whether early release will work. We are also negotiating salaries/longevity and sick/personal days. We are working hard to have a tentative agreement to present to members by June 9. This means we need everyone's support. Wear red EVERY Monday, show up at the upcoming caucus room (June 1), plan on attending the June 5 school board meeting, engage members at your buildings, attend PTA meetings at your school and share our platform, "Let us TEACH" (time, equity,

accountability, compensation, health).

#### Sick Days

Sick days roll over from year to year. Personal business days exceeding two, will roll into your sick bank and two additional ones will be added for the next school year. For the last two years we had been able to bank up to six PB days, but starting in August 2023, we will be going back to banking 4. Also, the number for absences to impact surplus are going back to 16 over the course of two years. In this case, it will be 16 combined days between the 2022–2023, 2023–2024 school years.

#### **TEACH Literacy Scholarship Deadline**


